Job Purpose

- Maintain a dynamic personal presence in the Club, to foster enthusiasm, sociability and active sporting involvement among existing and prospective members
- Work closely, constructively and creatively with the Club management team, sport committees/captains and independent Coaching staff to maximise the productive utilisation of all Club resources
