

Scottish Junior Nationals - General entry guide and regulations

1. Eligibility to enter Championships – anyone who is eligible to represent Scotland under the eligibility rules adopted by Scottish Squash and Racketball on www.scottishsquash.org.
2. The Championships will be played under the rules of the World Squash Federation (WSF) and the Scottish Squash and Racketball Code of Conduct and Fair Play Statement will apply.
3. The monrad system or round robins will be used. At the discretion of the Tournament Organiser, events may automatically be combined if insufficient entries are received.
4. Advertised times of matches should be regarded as a guide only. Matches will follow immediately after preceding matches wherever possible and so competitors should ensure that they are present at least one (1) hour prior to the advertised time of their matches. Only in exceptional circumstances where an alteration can be accommodated and is agreed by all players concerned may the schedule be differed from.
5. All players must compete in all scheduled matches, both main draw and play-off matches. Failure to complete all matches will result in participants being suspended from the following event and no points being awarded unless an appropriate medical certificate explaining a sound reason for this failure is provided to the Scottish Squash and Racketball Event Manager within the working week following the event. Once a player starts in the tournament, every match counts towards the Matrix whether a match is played or not.
6. All matches will be the best of 5 games and the Dunlop Pro XX yellow-dot ball will be used.
7. Par 11 (2 points clear) scoring will be used as adopted by the World Squash Federation.
8. WSF approved eyewear is compulsory for all juniors (Under 19) in line with Scottish Squash and Racketball's Eye Protection Policy. Entrants should provide their own approved eyewear and checks may be carried out.
9. No travel or other expenses will be paid.
10. Drug testing may take place at this event in line with Scottish Squash and Racketball's Anti-Doping Resolution.
11. Players may be required to mark and referee matches.
12. The decision of the Tournament Director will be final.
13. Players enter and play in this event at their own risk. Scottish Squash and Racketball and the host venue do not accept any responsibility for injury arising from participation in the tournament.
14. Video recording of some matches may take place at this event; photographs may also be taken for promotional purposes including publication on websites. By signing the entry form you indicate your acceptance of these conditions and parents (in the absence of any expressed objection) provide their consent to the taking and use of photos/videos.
15. The decision of the Tournament Director will be final.
16. In the event of a withdrawal prior to the closing date a full refund, less bank and administration fees, will be given.
In the event of a withdrawal after the closing date and before the draw date a 50% refund will be given less bank and administration fees.
In the event of a withdrawal on or after the day of the draw, no refunds will be given.
Refunds will be made on the Monday after the event.
