Scottish Squash Junior Selection Procedures and Criteria 2026-27

Introduction

A Selection Criteria Review Group meets prior to the start of each squash season to draft the team selection criteria for the coming season and agree the tournaments to be taken into account for the purposes of making selection decisions for the Representative Events. The selection tournaments for the 2026/27 squash season are outlined in Appendices 1 and 2.

The Scottish Squash Junior Selection Procedures and Criteria document (the “Selection Policy”) shall be communicated prior to the 2026/27 squash season and shall remain in place throughout the season. Any tournaments which are no longer going to be considered as part of the Selection Policy will be communicated, at the earliest opportunity, to all of the players within the selection process. The Head of Performance & Pathways is responsible for monitoring the Selection Policy at each stage in the process.

General

All players selected by Scottish Squash for teams and competitions must, to the satisfaction of the Selection Panel:

- Follow, and have followed, any guidelines published by Scottish Squash relating to the conduct and guidance of Scotland Squash Teams, including Player Agreements.
- Abide by the Scottish Squash Code of Conduct for Performance.
- Follow, and have followed, any guidelines published by Scottish Squash relating to anti-doping regulations.
- Maintain open communication regarding training, progress and tournament results with the Pathway Manager & Coach throughout the season.
- Selections are subject to the player not being under any kind of review for code of conduct or disciplinary issues from Scottish Squash.

Eligibility

In order to be selected to represent Scotland a player must meet the following requirements:

- The player must be eligible to represent Scotland by having been allocated a Scotland SPIN number by World Squash.
- The player must be a registered member of Scottish Squash Limited.

Team Selection

Selection Panel

Chairperson – Non-Executive Director (Performance) – Ali Bell. This individual will coordinate the panel selection process, ensuring both integrity of decision making and clarity with alignment to the selection criteria.

The Selection Panel is made up of three members:

- Head of Performance and Pathways – Paul Bell
- Pathway Manager and Coach – Kylie Lindsay

- Performance Coach – TBC

Team selections will be made by the Selection Panel. All panel members receive a vote. The Chairperson does not receive a vote. The Head of Performance and Pathways will have the casting vote in any deliberations between the Selection Panel. All selection meetings will be recorded in writing.

Selection process

Teams will be announced on [DATE TO BE CONFIRMED].

On the day of selection, players that are selected will be contacted by email, and reserves will also be contacted. Those unsuccessful in selection can contact the Head of Performance and Pathways for feedback.

The Pathway Manager & Coach will make all non-selected players aware of the appeal process, and will make all selected players aware that their selection is provisional and confidential until the conclusion of any appeal process.

Selection Criteria

This Selection Policy is used for the following Representative Events:

Stage 1 – Order of Merit

Places are filled automatically from the final Order of Merit standings for the relevant age group, taken in ranking order.

Stage 2 – Selection Panel Pick

The remaining place in each team is made by a Selection Panel pick. The Selection Panel will use the following in no particular order to help make their selection:

- Order of Merit standings.
- Head to head results against other players in contention for team selection.
- Results at events outside Scotland.

Members of the Selection Panel will apply their collective experience and judgement when assessing all players suitability for selection, taking into account a range of additional factors in conjunction with objective performance data and results. These may include but are not limited to; level of competition, player experience, current form trends, competitive temperament, attitude, professionalism, contribution to a team environment, and perceived potential to perform in the specific competitive context.

All players must make themselves available to attend any pre-event training camps, and any playoff matches or trials held in Scotland.

Order of Merit

The Order of Merit (OOM) is a ranking points structure that operates in accordance with the tournaments listed in Appendices 1 and 2 and links to the Scottish Selection Criteria for national team representative competitions.

- A player gains OOM points by competing in any of the tournaments listed in Appendices 1 and 2 and finishing in a placing for which points are allocated at that tournament.
- The higher the finishing position of the player, the more points that player receives towards their OOM total.
- Following each qualifying competition, the Order of Merit rankings will be updated and communicated to all players within the selection process.

The selection window opens at the first Scottish Junior Gold event and ends at the Scottish Junior Nationals. The final points total for each player will be their top 3 points scoring results from the selection events. Where fewer than three counting events were available to a player in an age group, all available results in that age group will be used.

Order of Merit regulations – all players

- If a player is eligible for more than one age group, their overall points total counts in all age groups they are eligible for, no matter which age group they earned them in, except as set out below.
- Points earned in an age group more than one above a player's own age group count towards the Order of Merit for that age group only.
- No Order of Merit points are awarded to a player who does not win at least one match in that age group at that event.
- At the Scottish Junior Nationals, points earned count only towards the Order of Merit for the age group in which they were earned. Where a player competes in two age groups at the Scottish Junior Nationals, the points earned in each age group count towards that age group only.
- At all other events, if a player enters two different age groups in one event, then only the highest points earned count towards the final points total, not both. This does not apply at Scottish Junior Gold events for girls, where points earned in the U13 draw and in the combined U15, U17 and U19 draw count towards their respective age groups as set out below.
- If players in contention for a team end on the same points total, then the last result between the two players will be taken. If there is no head to head result, the decision will be made by the Selection Panel.
- Where a player qualifies for two teams competing at the same Representative Event, the player may only be selected for one of them. The Selection Panel will determine which team the player is selected for, having consulted the player and the Pathway Manager & Coach. The place released in the other team will be filled by the next eligible player on that age group's Order of Merit, or, where the released place was a Selection Panel pick, by a further Selection Panel pick.

Scottish Junior Gold events – girls

Scottish Junior Gold events will be structured differently for the girls' age groups and the below rules apply for these events:

- The U15, U17, and U19 age groups will be combined into one draw.
- The U11 and U13 age groups will remain their own draws.
- Points allocation for the Junior Gold events are set out in Appendix 2 below.
- Points earned in the U15, U17 and U19 combined draw count towards any age groups the player is eligible for in the U15, U17 and U19 age group categories.
- Points earned in the U13 age group count towards the Order of Merit for that age group only.

Reserves

No travelling reserves will be selected for these events. A non-travelling reserve will be named for each age group, for boys and for girls.

Non-travelling reserve places will be selected by the Selection Panel using the following criteria:

- Final Order of Merit position.
- Head to head results against other players in contention for team selection.
- The performance record of the player in pressure situations in competition.
- The attitude and commitment of the player when preparing and competing for Scotland.

If a selected player withdraws from a team prior to the event, the place will be offered to the non-travelling reserve for that age group.

Injury

Selecting players who are injured

A player who is unable to compete in one or more selection events because of injury or illness will not receive Order of Merit points for those events. Such a player may be considered for the Selection Panel pick, where the Selection Panel may take into account evidence of the player's standard prior to the injury or illness, together with evidence of fitness to compete.

Deselecting players who become injured

The Head of Performance & Pathways and the Pathway Manager & Coach will have the right to request any player who is in contention, or who has been selected in a team, to undergo a medical examination by a medical practitioner nominated by the Head of Performance & Pathways. Based on the outcome of such an examination, a player may be deemed unfit for selection.

Appeals

The decision of the Selection Panel may be appealed on the following grounds:

- The selection policy was not properly followed and/or implemented;
- The selection policy has been misapplied, or applied without sufficient evidence;
- The selection process was made in bad faith and/or with bias and/or perversely and/or otherwise been demonstrably unfair; and/or
- The selection decision was one that no reasonable decision maker could have reached.

Any appeal must be made within seven days following the communication of the non-selection by the Pathway Manager & Coach. It should be made in writing, marked "Private & Confidential", to the CEO.

Composition of the Appeal Panel and Hearing Process

The timeframe for the Appeal Panel hearing being held will be considered on a selection by selection basis, giving sufficient time for players to put together their representations, whilst being mindful of proximity to the tournament at the subject of the appeal.

The members of any Appeal Panel will have had no involvement with the original decision and will be independent of the Selection Panel. The Appeal Panel will be made up of the following:

- A Scottish Squash Limited Board Member who sits on the Risk & Compliance Sub-Committee.
- An independent panel member from another sport.
- A second independent panel member from another sport.

The composition of the Appeal Panel will be considered prior to selections being communicated to ensure no unnecessary delays. If the player can demonstrate that the composition of the Appeal Panel is clearly unfair and/or conflicted, then Scottish Squash shall give consideration to arbitration before an independent panel appointed by Sport Resolutions.

In the case of an appeal being upheld, the Appeal Panel will refer the matter back to the Selection Panel for review, along with their reasons for requiring a review.

The decision of the Appeal Panel is final.
